I thought that prior to attending this show, having had such huge improvements made to the engine, my car could benefit from a spruce up of her interior. Having used to little effect leather cleaners and conditioners previously, I was somewhat sceptical of the results claimed by the makers of the reconditioning kit that I ordered from Woolies. My scepticism was however ill founded and the results of this easy to use product are quite amazing. Whilst retaining the patina developed over the last 36 years and unlikely to threaten any Gold Concours entrants, the claims are indeed justified. I wish I had taken before and after pictures to make a comparison, as the difference is again significant. For any members cars whose interiors, like mine, were looking a little tired, I cannot over recommend ordering from woollies – take a look at their website at www.woolies-trim.co.uk for details. Anyway, back to the event itself held over the end of May bank holiday weekend.

The Monday was largely dry, (except of course on each occasion when Ed thought it safe to drop the roof of the convertible) and again a tremendous turn out was enjoyed, our stand dominating the field as can been seen form the pics below. It was great to meet Bill Morgan and his family at this event and we look forward to seeing you again at many more. Still enjoying the significant improvement as a result of Steve Payne's tune up, my car has now been further complemented by the performance air filter fitted, so generously donated on long term loan by Alan Smith.
